"What is Jesus doing right now in heaven?"

This is just one of the questions the teenagers at our summer teen camp were asked to think about in their small groups. From August 23 to 26 fifteen teenagers and eight adults gathered in Gevgelija, Macedonia for four days and three nights of fun, Biblical teaching, relationship building and more. The theme for the camp was "Молитва има сила" ("Prayer has power"). Pastor Lazo Tanchev gave three inspiring messages explaining what prayer is,



challenging us to go deeper in our prayers, and warning us about things that can hinder our prayers.



On the first day, we learned that God wants us to seek Him and to bring Him our needs in prayer. He loves us and promises that if we seek Him, we will find Him; however, He wants us to seek Him with a spirit of gratitude. If we only ask without thankfulness, we can become like an annoying beggar! The second day, we learned that our prayer life is a sign of how close we are to God. We learned

that God wants us to pray regularly for ourselves and for others and that as His children, we can pray to Him anywhere at any time. On the last day, we learned that praising God in our prayers is very important. When Jesus prayed, the first thing He did was praise God. When we follow Jesus' example and pray with praise, gratitude, and faith in our hearts our prayers have power!

After each teaching time, the teens got into their small groups to discuss the lesson and their thoughts about prayer. We had team Fuji, team Vesuvius and team Krakatoa since volcanoes, like prayer, have a lot of power and you never know when a prayer will be answered, or a volcano will erupt! I am extremely thankful for our volunteers who engaged these teens in deep conversations and connected with them on a personal level.
